Clean Cities Coalitions Policy Action Alert Green School Bus Grant Program – Call Your Senator ASAP

Background:

Within the next few weeks, the Senate will be considering a comprehensive energy bill. The Union of Concerned Scientists (UCS) have developed and introduced legislation that would create Clean School Buses Grant Program. This program would replace the oldest and dirtiest diesel school buses-- those built before 1991-- with cleaner alternatives and would retrofit newer buses with. The alternative fuels and advanced technologies. A similar program was included in both House and Senate energy bills last session before the comprehensive energy bill died. UCS is coordinating a campaign to include this program in the comprehensive energy bill currently moving through the Senate.

Senate offices are now considering whether to include this program as an amendment to the energy bill, so it's important to act now so that the Senate version of the energy bill includes this important program.

Specifically, the House version (H.R. 1461) of this program would provide \$300 million in grant funds over three years for school districts to replace the oldest and dirtiest diesel school buses with ones that run on cleaner alternatives .such as natural gas and low-sulfur diesel fuels. The grant monies would go towards the cost of the bus and the associated infrastructure needed to fuel the bus – up to \$15,000 per bus. There is an opportunity to get similar legislation that would replace older buses and retrofit newer buses in the Senate energy bill. So the program could, potentially, get thousands of new, cleaner, alternative fueled and advance technology buses on the road!

Of the over 450,000 school buses on the road today, about one-third are aging diesel vehicles built to outmoded health and safety standards. These buses, built before 1991, are not compatible with emissions control technologies designed to clean up tailpipe emissions and should be replaced.

Diesel pollution has been linked to increased asthma rates, missed school days, hospitalizations, chronic bronchitis, heart disease, cancer, and even premature death. There are clean and cost-effective alternatives to standard diesel-powered school buses, including natural gas, propane, biodiesel and cleaner petroleum diesel fuel and buses equipped with particulate traps.

Actions:

- 1. Phone your Senators' office in the Capitol right away, and talk to his or her staff person. The contact information for select states and sample talking points are below.
- 2. Send this alert to members of your coalitions and interested friends to generate more calls into Senate offices.
- 3. Please send me (Sam Spofforth: sam@cocfc.org) an email letting me know who you called, the name of the person you spoke to and the results of the call. I'll report this to UCS. This is important because it will build credibility of our network of Clean Cities coalitions.
